One Haverhill Business Park site now under agreement

NORTH HAVERHILL-The Haverhill Business Park now includes one site, of eight, that is presently under agreement with entrepreneur Wayne Presby, who will be undertaking a biodiesel business there in the future as soon as other considerations for occupancy are settled.

The Haverhill Select Board has accepted an offer from Presby and will be looking at covenants on the business park proposal, such as compatibility and what the park should look like in the

future.

Select Board Chair Rick Ladd said in an interview that Presby has given the board an excellent proposal on his ideas for a building to operate the biodiesel business should his proposal be finally approved for implementation.

Ladd said Presby has made an offer on the land. He also said the board and Presby

Josiah French of Glenburn, ME kayaks the pristine waters of Lake Groton last Sunday. About a quarter of the shore-front of the 422-acre lake is owned by the State of Vermont. The rest is privately owned by about 125 camp and residence owners. The State bought the first tracts of land in this area in 1919 and continued to purchase parcels through 1975 when the state forest reached 25,000 acres. This makes the Groton State Forest the second largest protected area in Vermont. Within the Groton State Forest boundaries are seven state parks. The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) built many of the roads, trails, buildings, and campgrounds in use today. Those include the original Stillwater buildings and 13 campsites beside the lake, which has grown to 79 sites today. The CCC also built the main forest road, which evolved into Vermont Route 232.
